## **Tobacco Habit May Interfere With Your Dental Treatment**



Failure of attachment and no proper healing<sup>3,4</sup>



Poor healing<sup>3,4</sup>



High chances of implant failure<sup>3,4</sup>

### How does tobacco affect healing after dental procedures?<sup>5</sup>



Tobacco contains more than **7000 toxins.**<sup>6</sup>



Toxins in tobacco enter bloodstream.⁵



Combined effect of these toxins cause **poor wound healing.**<sup>7</sup>
